# High Court of London rejects Privinvest appeal in Mozambique hidden Debt Scandal

- The decision ensures that the case will extend into next year, coinciding with the end of President Nyusi's term in office. Nyusi, who has been implicated in the hidden debt scandal, has thus far enjoyed immunity as a sitting president.

The High Court in London has refused an application by Privinvest companies for permission to appeal a landmark judgment in favour of the Republic of Mozambique.

The case, involving Credit Suisse and Privinvest, centres on bribery and corruption tied to Mozambique's \$2 billion hidden debt scandal, which has been estimated to cost Mozambique more than \$ 11 billion until 2019<sup>1</sup>.

In its judgment, the court upheld findings that Privinvest bribed Mozambique's then-Finance Minister, Manuel Chang, to secure guarantees for loans linked to maritime projects. The projects later collapsed, leading to significant financial losses for Mozambique.

Privinvest argued that Mozambique's case suffered from disclosure failings and procedural issues, but the court found no merit in their grounds for appeal.

The court also dismissed Privinvest's claims that Mozambican law prevented liability for active corruption by legal entities. It ruled that the corruption allegations and associated financial losses were substantiated, and Mozambique's legal arguments were properly pleaded. The company founded by Iskandar Safa must pay Mozambique approximately 3 billion dollars in compensation for the damages caused by the hidden debts.

Privinvest's application for a stay of enforcement was partially granted, conditional on payment of £20 million to cover costs. The decision marks a significant step in Mozambique's efforts to recover damages and seek accountability in one of Africa's largest corruption scandals.


This is not a final decision, as Privinvest still has the option to appeal to the Court of Appeal. However, this development ensures that the case will extend into next year, coinciding with the end of President Nyusi's term in office. Nyusi, who has been implicated in the hidden debt scandal, has thus far enjoyed immunity as a sitting president<sup>2</sup>. Once he leaves office, Privinvest may seek to pursue legal action involving Nyusi directly.
